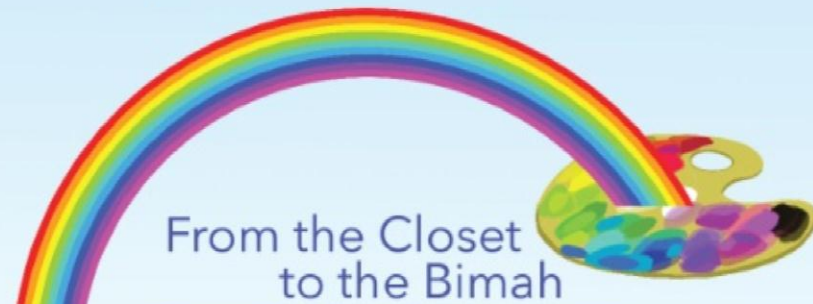


Kol Koleinu: The People Of The Book
